A research article for publication in PMRP will contain 2 parts: a structured abstract / summary and the article itself. Satisfaction and successful review of these parts will result in the publishing of the case. Each author (or team) will be actively supported to maximize the likelihood of publication.

Part 2: The article

Beyond asking for a structured document and the aspects listed in the abstract, the research article itself is open for interpretation and the creativity of the author(s). Its value and, consequently, the principles that will guide the review, will come from its originality, support to key public priorities and immediate usefulness to project managers and researchers associated with those priorities. The strength of the research evidence and persuasiveness of writing will, naturally, heighten its value.

Researchers are directed to reflect on the following questions when writing their articles:

- Does the submission address one or more of the key PMRP topics and/or other public priorities?
- Is the paper consistent with the methodological principles of PMRP? In other words, does it use a qualitative or mixed method design (or method collection)?
- Does the paper include information and insight that could be immediately actionable for a project or program manager?
- What core competencies does your research support / develop?
- What are the major claims of the paper? How are they innovative? Please be specific and relate the claims to PM practice, research and/or education.
- Will the article be meaningful to another stakeholder associated with one of PMRP's key topics?
- Are the claims appropriately discussed in the context of previous literature? If not, could you identify key items for the author(s) to consider?
